

MHCWS HORSE CLUB HIGH POINT AWARD

All family and individual members of the Morgan Horse Club of Washington State are eligible to participate in this annual high point awards program. A club member who is part of a syndicate or partnership or is a shareholder of a horse is also eligible to participate (proof of ownership may be required).

Horses owned or leased by club members earn points from placing in **Morgan classes** in horse shows; placing in **Morgan and/or open competitive trail rides; Morgan Sport Horse and/or open Sport Horse events (see specs for Sport Horse on page 2), USDF recognized dressage events, and/or Morgan working events, (see specs for Working Morgan on page 2) wherever they are held.** The calendar period for awards is **November 1 through October 31**

Placing in shows, sport horse or dressage events must be sent to the High Point Secretary **within 30 days** following the close of the competition or they will be forfeited. Note: Placing from Grand Nationals, sport horse or USDF recognized dressage events held in October must be **received** by October 31st. Points must be submitted on an official form or duplicate thereof to be eligible. (Points might not be awarded if applications are found to contain incomplete and/or incorrect information.)

There must be 3 horses entered in the class for points to count.

Show Points:

Morgan Senior Exhibitor and Open Classes to fifth place:

Points in all Championship Performance classes will be double the system ratings. In-hand classes will accrue points in all age group classes as listed above. Junior and Senior Champion and Reserve Champion winner will receive double points; Grand Champion and Reserve in hand will receive triple points.

Junior Horse classes: Full points for Junior Horses awarded in classes restricted to horses four-years or under. Driving classes for two-year-olds, three-year-olds, and four-year olds will count full points if complimentary classes are offered to accommodate these age groups. Saddle classes for three-year olds, or three-year olds and under, and classes for four-year olds will count full points if the complimentary class is offered.

All other restricted classes will count ½ points. (Maiden, Novice, Ladies, Ladies Adult Amateur and Ladies Amateur, Youth, etc.) Note: Amateur Ladies classes count for full points.

Points from only the eight best shows per horse or junior exhibitor will be counted. For Junior Exhibitor awards, only points for one horse/rider combination count per award for the year.

Open, Stallions, Mares, Geldings, Under 15 Hands, Over 15 Hands, Amateur, Owner, and all Championship classes per system rating. Also half points to count for Ladies, Gentlemen, Pro-Am, Maiden, Novice, Youth, Master, Amateur Owned Trained and Shown, Limit, Amateur Ladies and Combination.

HUNTER PLEASURE

Open, Stallions, Mares, Geldings, Under 15 Hands, Over 15 Hands, Bridle Path Hack, Amateur, Owner and all Championship classes per system rating. Also half points to count for Ladies, Gentlemen, Pro-Am, Maiden, Novice, Youth, Master, Amateur Owned Trained and Shown, Amateur Ladies and Limit.

CLASSIC PLEASURE SADDLE

CLASSIC PLEASURE DRIVING

Open, Stallions, Mares, Geldings, Under 15 Hands, Over 15 Hands, all Championship classes per system rating. Also half points to count for Ladies, Gentlemen, Maiden, Novice, Youth, Master, Amateur Owned Trained and Shown, and Limit.

JUNIOR HORSE UNDER SADDLE

All Junior Horse English Pleasure, Western Pleasure, Hunter Pleasure, Classic Saddle, Park Saddle and all Championship classes per system rating.

JUNIOR HORSE DRIVING

All Junior Horse Pleasure Driving, Classic Driving, Park Harness and all Championship classes per system rating.

WORKING MORGAN

Working Cow, Stock Horse, Reining, Cutting, Western Riding, Trail (English, Western, Hunt), Carriage Driving, Cavalcade Americana, Roadster Under Saddle, Roadster to Bike, Jumping, Hunter Over Fences, Hunter Hack, Road Hack, Side Saddle, Parade, Versatility, Justin Morgan and all Championship classes per system rating.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR, WESTERN *

Western Jr. Exhibitor classes including: Equitation (NO Medal classes), Showmanship, Fitting & Showing, Pleasure and all Championship classes per system rating.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR, ENGLISH *

English Jr. Exhibitor classes including: Equitation (NO Medal Classes), Showmanship, Fitting & Showing, Pleasure, Park, Driving and all Championship classes per system rating.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR, HUNT SEAT *

Hunt Seat Jr. Exhibitor classes including: Equitation (NO Medal Classes), Showmanship, Fitting & Showing, Pleasure and all Championship classes per system rating.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR, DRIVING

Jr Exhibitor Park Harness and Pleasure Driving classes to count per system rating.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR, WALK TROT

Jr Exhibitor Pleasure and Equitation classes to count per system rating.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR CLASSIC PLEASURE

Jr Exhibitor Classic Pleasure Driving and Saddle classes to count per system rating.

ADULT – AMATEUR OVERALL

All Amateur performance classes, regardless of horse. (First place only; no runner up.)

SPORT HORSE

Driven Dressage, Combined Driving, Pairs Driving, and Eventing competitions sanctioned by the USEF and/or the appropriate official Federation affiliated organization, as well as Morgan Sport Horse In-Hand classes to count per system rating. In-Hand class points to be tabulated as per Open In-Hand section.

COMPETITIVE TRAIL

Junior, Lightweight, Middleweight, Heavyweight

DRESSAGE –INTRODUCTORY & TRAINING LEVELS

Ridden Dressage. Average of four highest scores from **at least** two different judges.

DRESSAGE – FIRST LEVEL & ABOVE

Ridden Dressage. Average of four highest scores from **at least** two different judges.

*Junior Exhibitors must state attire for Showmanship or Fitting & Showing, i.e., Western, Saddle Seat or Hunt Seat. One horse/rider combination to count – please mark clearly on form.
